PE & Sports Premium Funding September 2015 - July 2016

This is the third year of the extra sports funding - Sports Pupil Premium.

In our school this will amount to £8910 annually. The PE Premium funding is being used to improve PE and Sport Provision across the school.

This initiative is being led by Kathryn Afford and is being monitored by the SLT and Governing Body.

Our objectives at Courtland School:

- Continue to promote high quality physical education to our children
- For children to receive 'additional' provision on top of the existing Courtland School PE offer.
- For children to have experience in competitive activities.
- Improve confidence amongst staff in the delivery of high quality PE lessons across the school.
- To ensure the Healthy Schools agenda remains high priority
- To ensure children's physical development leads to better outcomes for children in terms of their writing and physical development.

To facilitate this we are providing:

- *A sports Apprentice to support Class Teachers to maintain high quality PE lessons*
- *A range of Additional Clubs and structured playtime sessions delivered by the Sports Apprentice*
- *A range of additional lunchtime and afterschool clubs by external providers*
- *Additional sports coaching sessions for Y1 & Y2 with qualified instructors*
- *Increased opportunities for EYFS to access outside facilities provided by the Sports Apprentice*
- *On-going focus and training for Play Leaders to lead effective playground games*
- *Opportunities for children to take part in competitive intra school activities and wider school events*
- *Opportunities for children to take part in competitive inter school activities.*
- *A focus on healthy living and eating*

We feel that this is the most effective and efficient way for the funding to have a long lasting and positive effect on future learning and physical development of children within our school

BUDGET - £8910

- £1200 Membership of the Barnet Primary Sports Service
- £1500 towards Sports Coaching sessions for Y1 & Y2
- £720 for supply cover for CPD and staff release for courses / modelling
- £342 for equipment for PE lessons and in the playground
- £5148 Funding for the Sports Apprentice

Where appropriate additional funding is provided out of the School Necessitous Pupil Budget and/or Pupil Premium for individual identified children to enable all children to have equal access.

The Impact this year as a result of the funding has been:

- Teachers are more confident to teach Dance & Gym lessons. We have seen extracts of lessons as part of class assemblies that clearly show the children are developing good skills. There was also an increase in the number of children joining the Gym club and a second Gym club was introduced to meet the demand.
- Gym and Cheerdance assemblies gave the children an opportunity to see what they can aspire to achieve and they have highlighted the enjoyment gained from joining these clubs. Numbers increased as the year progressed.
- The Karate club continued to be popular and a second club was introduced for the younger children.
- The Netball club proved successful as they came second in the league and tournament.
- The Football club was successful as the number of matches played increased. In addition to this a girls football team was introduced and proved to be very popular.
- Play Leaders confidently lead Children's games at Playtimes
- A small number of Play Leaders were chosen to participate in the Bronze Ambassador Leadership course which they successfully completed.
- Time was allocated for the PE leader to implement a new Sports Day format which was very successful for promoting competitive sport

As part of our planned expenditure for this year we have introduced the following:

- The introduction of the KS1 Change for life programme
- The introduction of a YOYO club for gross & fine motor skills
- Increased participation in local tournaments
- Increased participation in structured playtime activities
- Termly participation in Virtual challenges
- Increased EYFS participation in PSED and Physical development
- Mentoring a Sports Apprentice which is supporting the Barnet Sports Partnership

Future plans for Courtland will be:

- To embed the Sports Day format for the whole school
- To further develop our intra house competitions
- To induct a new Sports Apprentice to maintain participation levels in competitions
- To build links with other schools in the Partnership to develop multi skills festivals for KS1
